**Announcements and opening prayer.**



**Connect:** an opportunity for people to immediately interact and connect with each other; icebreaker/attention getters. **Icebreaker:** What usually happens when people make bad choices? How easy is it to put a really bad choice behind you?

**The Bottom Line:** Love obeys God and is transformed because of it.

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**LESSON PLAN**



**Denotes “Apply”**

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*Today we are going to look at the love of God and how our failures to not need to destroy that relationship, but rather seize the experience to grow in that relationship. Today's lesson gives us help in our weakness and assurance in our hope.*

**Read 1 John 2:1-2**

1. John begins with the address, “My dear children, or My little children.” Why do you think John used this phrase?

*John is their spiritual father. He loves and cares about them deeply, as if they were his own physical children. At this point, John is getting old. He's probably known many of these servants for some time. The three letters were probably written from Ephesus where he likely was the Pastor until his death around A.D. 98.*

**⌚ What lesson can we learn from this simple address?**

2. In his own words, why is John writing this letter?

**⌚ What would you say to the person who says, “I need Jesus, but I don't need the church. I can have a right relationship without all the mess of the church?”**

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3. Here comes the real encouragement. We will all fall into sin at various times. So, what happens if we do?

*The word used is PARAKLETÉTOS, which means an advocate or intercessor. It was used of someone who pleads someone's cause before a judge. When I fail, Jesus does not walk away from me or turn His back on me. Rather, He goes to my defense! Jesus understands the temptations of this world first hand and He understands when we are fighting to walk in faith and stumble. Note that it only matters because the One who is pleading for us is the Righteous One who overcame sin and the world.*

- ⌚ How does the reality of that promise strengthen your faith and make you better able NOT to continue in sin?

4. According to John, for whose sins did Jesus atone?

*Everyone has an opportunity because of His sacrifice to atone or make payment for our sins. We have to use our free will to make the choice to accept that offer on His terms*

*The Atoning Sacrifice was also translated as The Propitiation. The word HILASMOS meant something that appeases anger and brings reconciliation with someone who has reason to be angry with you. Jesus is our Propitiation. For the wages of sin is death, but because Jesus because the sacrifice, the propitiation for us, the debt was paid to settle with God.*



**Interactive Teaching Ideas:** ideas for learner-focused teaching. Ask the class to discuss at each table the following assignment and then share the results from each table: **Take the idea of the propitiation and design a story that will simplify that truth so you could tell it in a way that even a child could understand.**
